Come and join us to celebrate Make Music Day in Southwark

Help us to fill the streets and spaces of Southwark with live music on Friday 21 June 2019! The Culture and Events team are co-ordinating a programme of free music performances in libraries across the borough from 2-5pm and on Southwark Park bandstand from 6-8pm.

We are looking for performers to take part in this unique programme to showcase and promote the amazing diverse musical talent in Southwark.

Performers at 4.45pm on the day will be invited to take part in a live performance of the official Make Music Day UK song, *Bring Me Sunshine*, which will be live-streamed across the Council's social media platforms.

To take part in the programme, please read the guidance below and complete and return an expression of interest form.

Background and context

[Make Music Day](#) is a free celebration of voluntary music that takes place on 21 June each year in 120 countries around the world. This international event encourages all types of musicians and music groups to put on events in their communities to celebrate and promote music-making.

Make Music Day is based on France's Fête de la Musique which has been running for over 30 years. In France, the event is enormous, with every street corner and town square filled with music for the day; the event reached two thirds of the population of France last year!

Make Music Day in the UK has only been running for a couple of years. In 2018 180 events were held across the UK reaching around 10,000 people. Events included performances, open rehearsals, sing-alongs, open mic nights and flashmobs in all sorts of spaces including shopping centres, hospitals, train stations, libraries, pubs, parks etc.

Southwark Council joined the celebrations in 2018, producing a video of the Make Music Day song "[Bring Me Sunshine](#)", featuring acts from across the

borough. This year we are developing the programme even further, and will be supporting local musicians from across the borough to perform in our libraries and on Southwark Park bandstand.

We will be promoting all Make Music Day activities through the Southwark Presents what's on diary and social media channels as part of our #SouthwarkSunshine summer events campaign; through Southwark Council communications channels; and via the national Make Music Day website.

Everything you need to know about taking part

- Your set should last between 15 to 20 minutes
- Your set must be acoustic, unless performing outdoors at Peckham Library or Southwark Park
- All performances will be free for anyone to attend
- You should provide all the music equipment you need for your performance
- By taking part, you agree to your performance being live streamed online and for images and recordings made during Make Music Day to be used by the council to promote future initiatives
- You must have appropriate public liability insurance, and complete a risk assessment with the libraries team prior to your performance
- There will be no fee for performing as part of Make Music Day
- Each successful applicant will be provided with £50 towards costs of staging their performance

Selection process
